Re: **NOTICE OF TERMINATION OF ALCOHOL LICENSES**
Fuzions – 806 North Broad Street, Monroe, Georgia 30655
License Numbers 35606 & 35607

Dear Mr. Brown:

The City of Monroe, Georgia (the "City") Code Department records indicate that you are the current holder of two alcohol licenses numbered 35606 and 35607 issued on December 28, 2017 for on-premises consumption of beer and wine and spirituous liquors, attached hereto and incorporated fully herein as Exhibits "A" and "B" (the "Alcohol Licenses"), for the above-referenced business known as Fuzions, operating at 806 North Broad Street, Monroe, Georgia 30655 (the "Business"). This correspondence is to inform you of the revocation and termination of the Alcohol Licenses pursuant to Section 6-17(a) of Chapter 6, Article I, of the City of Monroe Code of Ordinances (the "Code"). **NOTICE OF REVOCATION OF THESE ALCOHOL LICENSES FOR THE REMAINDER OF THEIR TERM IS HEREBY MADE ON THIS DATE.**

Section 6-17(a) of the Code allows for the suspension or revocation of a license by me as the code enforcement officer "where the licensee furnishes fraudulent or untruthful information in the application for a license." See Monroe, Georgia, Municipal Code, Code of Ordinances § 6-17(a). Information contained in an alcohol license application submitted by Rejimon Mathew on November 7, 2017, appears to show that FRMV, Inc. sold all of its interests in the Business located at 806 Broad Street on or about December 16, 2016. The relevant document appears to be signed by you. Even after this apparent sale of the Business, you continued to report food and alcohol sales of the business to the City under Alcohol Licenses held by FRMV, Inc. for calendar year 2017.

Further, this timeline of your current lack of ownership in the Business was confirmed directly to me and the City Administrator by you in a conversation at the Business while the City was addressing a sewer line repair issue on January 31, 2018. This violation of the Business providing fraudulent information to obtain the Alcohol Licenses is not permitted by the Code, or Georgia law, and the "code enforcement officer may suspend or revoke the license of any establishment which does not meet the licensing qualifications set forth in this chapter at any time such knowledge becomes known to him.

” See Monroe, Georgia, Municipal Code, Code of Ordinances § 6-17(f).

Based upon all of the information received by my office to date, your applications under which the Alcohol Licenses were issued contain fraudulent and untruthful information related to your ownership interests in the Business. The Business was sold by FRMV, Inc. in late 2016, yet the Business continued to obtain City alcohol licenses under that entity and your name for calendar years 2017 and 2018.

Under Section 6-18 of the Code, you have the right to appeal my decision to revoke your Alcohol Licenses. Your appeal must be filed by way of written petition in my office within fifteen (15) days of the date of this letter. See Monroe, Georgia, Municipal Code, Code of Ordinances § 6-18(b). Should you choose to appeal this revocation in a timely manner, you are entitled to a hearing before the Mayor and City Council, and are permitted to present evidence and cross-examine opposing witnesses. See O.C.G.A. § 3-3-2 (b); Monroe, Georgia, Municipal Code, Code of Ordinances § 6-18.

BY NOTICE OF THIS LETTER, AND UNDER MY AUTHORITY CONTAINED IN THE CITY OF MONROE CODE OF ORDINANCES, YOUR ALCOHOL LICENSES ARE REVOKED. YOU MAY NOT SERVE OR SELL ALCOHOL AT THE BUSINESS WITHOUT A VALID LICENSE. ANY SERVICE OR SELLING OF ALCOHOL BY YOU OR ANYONE ELSE AT THE BUSINESS WILL SUBJECT YOU AND OTHERS TO FURTHER CODE ENFORCEMENT AND POSSIBLE CRIMINAL PROSECUTION. GOVERN YOUR CONDUCT ACCORDINGLY.


