

Class description: This is a class taught by SRO's trained in Active Shooter Response and will be held in a school setting. There will be a classroom lecture and hands on training with simunition weapons and rounds. Attendees will be equipped with the proper safety attire and equipment needed to safely perform the training scenarios. Scenarios will place the administrator/SRO into the stressful duty of the responding officer responding to an active shooter and will allow you to see the importance of training, preparation and the split second decisions to shoot or don't shoot. Refreshments will be provided and if attendees miss a scheduled working lunch, lunch will be provided at the training location on those days. Classes are limited to 20 students on each day and classes will be held June 8, 9 and 10th from 8:30 AM-12:00 PM. Class will require participants to engage in physical activity. 

REGIONAL COUNTERDRUG TRAINING ACADEMY

Interview and Interrogation

Length: 5 days

Designed For: This course is designed for police professionals choosing to enhance their ability to gain information in the interview and interrogation process to include the patrol officer with minimal experience to the most seasoned police investigator who will gain insight into information gathering.

Prerequisites: The individual attending must be committed to examining themselves and others to find clues that may be utilized to realize the highest levels of human interaction in an arena of respect and dignity.

Certification : This course is POST certified in the states of Mississippi and Georgia and accepted for certification in other states.

Description: This five(5)day course provides the police professional with:

- Knowledge and skills to understand the concepts of personality assessment and evaluation
- How to recognize and overcome personal bias influences
- How to utilize a systematic approach to gathering data and information in the interview and interrogation process
- How to formulate and evaluate questions in achieving the goal of discovering the truth while conducting investigations in a wide variety of violations
- Evaluation and utilization of verbal signals of deception
- Awareness of theme building and application based on emotional and psychological needs
- Understanding body language and how it may be used to determine deception in other and by the investigator for rapport building
- The use of conscious and subconscious rapport building and how to determine truth and veracity
 of individual statement and actions through the observation and evaluation of cues leaked by the
 subconscious mind
- This course is presented with ethics and the respect for human dignity as the guiding principle in the ethical, moral and legal application of techniques designed to maximize gathering data while insuring the constitutional and civil rights of all people.

False Alarm Ordinance

ARTICLE III. PUBLIC SAFETY ALARMS

Sec. 58-50. Definitions.

The following words, terms and phrases, when used in this article, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this section, except where the context clearly indicates a different meaning:

Alarm system means an assembly of equipment and devices designated and arranged to detect a fire or signal an unauthorized intrusion into premises or an attempted robbery at protected premises and, with respect to such signal, public safety officers are expected to respond.

False alarm means the activation of an alarm system thereby necessitating a Response by any public safety officer where an emergency does not and did not exist and includes, but is not limited to, mechanical failure, malfunction, improper installation and maintenance, or the negligence of the owner or lessee of an alarm system or his employees or agents, but does not include alarm activation caused by violent conditions of nature or other extraordinary circumstances not reasonably subject to control by the alarm user or alarm system business.

Response means the dispatch of a public safety officer to the premises where an alarm system has been activated indicating hold-up, break-in, unauthorized entry, destruction of property, or fire is presently in progress on those premises.

Cross references: Definitions and rules of construction generally, § 1-2.

Sec. 58-51. Unlawful activation; failure to notify police department of malfunction or repair work.

It shall be unlawful for anyone to activate any fire, robbery or burglar alarm for the purpose of summoning public safety officers except in the event of a hold-up, breakin, burglary, unauthorized entry, destruction of property, fire, an occurrence to which police or fire personnel response are expected to respond, or for anyone notifying the police department of an activated alarm and having knowledge that such activation was apparently caused by an electrical or other malfunction of the alarm system, or was apparently caused by maintenance or service to the alarm system, to fail at the same time to notify the police department of such apparent malfunction or repair.

Sec. 58-52. Notice to owners/lessees of premises of false alarm.

For each and every false alarm response, within a reasonable time thereafter, the City will send written notice to the owner or lessee of the premises of the false alarm informing them of the date, time, and location of the false alarm necessitating the public safety officers' response. Depending on the number of false alarm responses required in

that calendar year, the notice will provide the appropriate corrective action necessary and fines to be paid, if applicable, pursuant to Sec. 58-53.

Sec. 58-53. Response to false alarm; fees; corrective action.

- (a) For the first false alarm response to any premises within the City limits at which no other false alarm has occurred within a calendar year period, the person or business having or maintaining such fire, burglary and or robbery alarm shall, within seven (7) working days after notice to do so, make a written report to the chief of police on forms prescribed by him setting forth the cause of such false alarm, the corrective action taken, whether such alarm has been inspected by an authorized serviceman, and such other information as the chief of police may require to determine the cause of such false alarm and corrective action necessary.
- (b) For the second false alarm response to any premises within the City limits after a first false alarm response within a calendar-year period, a written report shall be required as for a first response and the city may inspect or cause to be inspected the alarm system at such premises and prescribe necessary corrective action and shall give notice to the person or business having or maintaining such alarm system of the conditions and requirements of this article, including the fee requirements for three (3) or more false alarm responses within each calendar year.
- (c) After the third false alarm response to any premises within the city limits within a calendar year, and for all succeeding responses within that calendar year, the director of finance shall charge and collect from the person or business having or maintaining such fire, burglary and or robbery alarm system on the premises owned or occupied by him, a fee in the amount of Two Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$250.00) per false alarm response, which shall be due within 30 days from the date of notice as required by Sec. 58-52. If such false alarms are as a result of failure to take necessary corrective action prescribed by the city, the city may order the disconnection of such alarm system and it shall be unlawful to reconnect such alarm system until such corrective action is taken; provided that no disconnection shall be ordered as to any premises required by law to have an alarm system in operation.

Sec. 58-54. Collection of false alarm penalty

In the event the user fails to submit the penalty payment for a third or subsequent false alarm response penalty within 30 days of receiving notice of said violation, the city clerk shall issue an execution for the false alarm penalty that is due and owing. The lien shall cover the property of the individual or business liable for payment of the delinquent false alarm penalty and become fixed as of the date and time it became delinquent. The failure to pay the civil penalty within 30 days of the execution shall be subject to punishment as provided in section 1-11. All other proceedings in relation thereto shall be as provided by the Code and charter of the city and state law.
